The William Julius Wilson Institute's Power of Place Convening

<u>The William Julius Wilson Institute</u> is a project that grew out of <u>the Harlem Children's Zone</u>. Led by Geoffrey Canada the Institute works in partnership to deliver comprehensive strategies, support services, and tools that systematically root out poverty and close opportunity gaps in neighborhoods across America. Once a year, the Institute gathers all of its partners for a national convening. This year's took place from October 18th to the 20th in New Orleans, Louisiana. Several community organizations from Memphis were there, including representatives from the Shelby County YPAR Project.

Keuana Cheers, the head of our Local Research Coordinating Organization <u>Beyond Educating</u>, and her husband Raymond got the van all washed up and drove down to the event with four of our researchers: Nicolas Bess, Tanyya Briscoe, Dianna McCrary, and Jessica Langston. We'll let Keuana take it from here:

"The conference was an out-of-this-world experience!!! The confidence that the Youth Researchers expressed was breathtaking to see. The researchers understood what their purpose was for attending this conference and they let everyone who would listen to them know about this exciting project."



On the final day, Nicolas and Dianna gave reflective dialogues about their experiences in front of at least 150 people during the closing session. The conference attendees, including Geoffery Canada, listened to them and embraced them. In fact, Mr Canada said Dianna's comments made him realize that his work is not complete and there is an improvement that can be made in his program. He'll be visiting Memphis in a few months and wants to spend time with the researchers and learn more about this project!



We met several organizations that want to visit Memphis to follow up on the YPAR research that our team is conducting. We have been invited to Houston, Texas, and Oakland, California to visit local educational agencies' place-based, cradle-to-career strategies that are effective.




The trip showed us all how this YPAR pilot is the base of something that leads to the effectiveness that was displayed by the researchers at this conference."

Research progress update

The YPAR researchers have just kicked off their first research sprint. Over the next three weeks, each of our three research teams will work with their local research coordinator to choose a topic related to Opportunity Youth and conduct some initial research. For example, the team that is being facilitated by The Collective Blueprint will be looking into a topic around employment. This short sprint will then feed into a larger research sprint that will take place in December and January. More details on this will be in the next weekly update.
